

Teachers urged to make teaching more attractive

Education and Cultural Affairs Minister Prof. A. Q. M. Badrud-
doza Chowdhury Wednesday
called upon the teachers to make
their teaching method attractive to
make students more attentive to
their studies, reports BSS.

He said, "if you can attract the
students they will discard tarror-
ism and malpractice in the exami-
nations".

The Education Minister was
addressing as chief guest the Con-
ference of Bangladesh Govern-
ment College Lecturers' Associa-
tion at the Eden University Col-
lege Auditorium here.

State Minister for Education
Principal N. Yunus Khan attended
the function as the special guest.

Presided over by Kamal Ataur
Rahman, President of the Associa-
tion, the function was addressed,
among others, by the Eden Col-
lege Principal Prof. Jahanara Be-
gum, and Mr. Omar Faruq, Secre-
tary General of the Association.

Prof. Chowdhury said the
standard of education in the coun-
try had reached a pitiable low and

urged the teachers to play an ef-
fective role in recuperating it.

He stressed the need for closer
relations between the teachers and
the students.

Referring to the mass educa-
tion programme, introduced by
Shahed President Ziaur Rahman,
the Education Minister said this
programme would be restarted
soon he sought active cooperation
of the teachers in this sector.

Assuring the college teachers
that their problems would be
looked into sympathetically, the
Education Minister said a commit-
tee would be formed soon to take
up the matter.

Principal Yunus Khan called
upon the teachers to give all their
mite in introducing a mass-ori-
ented education policy initiated by
the BNP government.

He said compulsory primary
education would be introduced in
the country side by side with the
reintroduction the mass education
programme.

He said all should work to-
gether to remove the problems ac-
cumulated in the education sector.

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
