

DU problems to be resolved: Sircar

Education Minister, Barrister Jamiruddin Sircar Thursday said the present government was doing everything possible for the welfare of the teachers and students of Dhaka University and all problems of this institution would be resolved as and when necessary, reports BSS.

Replying to a call attention motion moved by M. Reysat Ali of Jamaat-e-Islam, the Education Minister said the government would not hesitate to provide land if the university so required.

He said the Dhaka University, established in 1921, was to have 580 acres of land under the report of the Nathan Commission. In 1934, a total of 252 acres was ultimately given to the University.
