

Probe body formed DU incident condemned

Dhaka University Syndicate in an emergency meeting Monday afternoon condemned the incidents of indiscipline and terrorists activities inside the Vice-Chancellor's office on the day in presence of national political leaders and members of the Syndicate.

The Syndicate formed a five-member inquiry committee headed by Prof. Anwarullah Chowdhury, Dean of the Faculty of Social Science to probe the incident.

The syndicate urged all political parties to convince their student's fronts to maintain peace and

tranquility shunning the path of terrorism.

It also called upon members of law enforcing agencies to gear up their activity on the campus to protect deterioration of law and order situation.

Jamaat Leaders meanwhile, strongly protested the attack on Party Secretary General Maulana Matiur Rahman Nizami by some unruly students at the Office of Dhaka University Vice-Chancellor.

Maulana Matiur Rahman Nizami, MP, went to attend a meeting of all-party political leaders convened by the university authorities to discuss campus situation on Monday noon.

Presided over by City Jamaat President Mr. Abdul Kader Molah, the protest meeting was held at the north gate of Baitul Mokarram Mosque on Monday afternoon.

Speakers at the meeting held the Vice-Chancellor responsible and demanded his resignation for his failure to ensure adequate security for political leaders.

They also demanded removal of concerned police official for the failure in maintaining law and order situation on the campus.

Jamaat workers later brought out a procession to protest the attack and announced a country-wide protest programme today (Tuesday). A protest rally will be held at the Northgate of the Baitul Mokarram Mosque at 5 p.m.

Meanwhile, Five-party alliance in an emergency meeting mentioned the incident as 'undesireable' adding that such violence in presence of political leaders would strengthen the hands of terrorists and weaken the anti-violence spirit.

Bangladesh Jatiyatabadi Chhatra Dal in a separate statement condemned the attack on jamaat leader in a meeting convened by the university authorities.

Chhatra Dal leaders also condemned ransacking of the Office of the Vice-Chancellor and the attempt to foil the anti-violence move on the campus.

Chhatra Dal accused the supporters and workers of Chhatra League (Alam-Ashim) and demanded immediate arrest of the persons involved in the incident.

Meanwhile, Ganotantrik Biplobi Jote, Bangladesh Chhatra Federation, Biplobi Chhatra Sangha, Chhatra Oikya Forum and Bangladesh Chhatra Maitry protested the presence of Jamaat leader on the campus and criticised the role of Dhaka University

authorities in inviting the anti-liberation forces on the campus. Chhatra Maitry criticised the attack and termed it an 'undemocratic' behaviour on the part of a particular organization.

DUCSU VP Amanullah Aman, MP, and G.S. Khairul Kabir Khokan, in a joint statement, Monday condemned the attack on a political leader in the campus by some miscreants.

They said the assaulted leader came by invitation of the University Syndicate to attend a meeting aimed at helping restoration of congenial atmosphere in the campus.

DUCSU V.P. charged BCL (S-A) for the attacking on leader, teachers and journalists and said BCL (S-A) once again had showed its real face. They also condemned the ransacking of the V.C.'s chambers.
