Barguna Govt Girls' High School in grip of problems

BARGUNA, Nov 28: The Barguna Government Girls High School has been facing manifold problems hampering the education of students.

Established in 1972 the school was nationalised in 1985 but education facilities and requisite number of teachers have not yet been provided to run the school smoothly.

There were 25 teachers in the school for about 300 students. But only 20 teachers, of present, are working in the school. Nine posts of teachers have been lying vacant for the last three years.

Due to absence of staff quarters the teachers are living in private houses. Acute shortage of class rooms hampered education in the school.

The main building was unfinished. The entire building has become unfit for holding

classes. Rain water falls in the class rooms through leakages. There are no library and reading room, common room and hostel. The school has no auditorium for holding meetings and cultural functions.

The school is facing shortage of furniture including sitting arrangements for the students. In the absence of adequate number of class rooms all classes are suspended during the SSC test examination. There is no canteen in the school.

There is no fans in the class rooms. The absence of fans causes suffering to the teachers and students during the summer. Extra curriculum activities are almost absent in the school.

While contacted Head teachers of the school told this correspondent that the school has been facing a host of problems.
