Workshop on population education ends

A 10-day workshop of the college teachers on population education was concluded on Saturday in the Technical Teachers' Training Institute, Tejgaon, Dacca, according to an official announcement.

The concluding session was presided over by the Executive Director of Population Education Programme. In his presidential address the Executive Director urged upon the participating college teachers for sincerely applying their expert knowledge gained through the training so that it can have a multiplier effect in the society. He reminded them of their responsibility to the nation as highly educated section of the population.

The workshop was participated by 31 teachers of different government and non-government colleges of the country. They will teach population education to the students when the subject will be introduced in the college syllabus. They will also be used resource persons in the district and thana level workshops on population education.

The workshop was inaugurated on July 18 by Prof M.A. Naser, Chairman, University Grants Commission at the Institute of Business Administration, University of Dacca. Mr F.S. Miles, the British High Commissioner in Bangladesh was present on the occasion.

In all 24 teachers from different universities and proposed university colleges participated in the workshop.

During the course of workshop different teachers discussed some of the problems faced by the university teachers in improving their teaching methods and read some valuable papers.

Prof M.A. Naser distributed the certificates to the participating teachers on the concluding day.
