

DUTA's work stoppage threat

Dhaka University Teachers Association (DUTA) at a meeting on Wednesday threatened abstention from work if the government fails to take effective measures to contain violence on the campus.

Presided over by Prof Anwarullah Chowdhury, President of the association, the meeting observed that the government was primarily responsible for maintaining law and order in the country. The meeting expressed surprise over what it said non-initiative in taking adequate measures to ensure peace on the campus.

The DUTA warned if the concerned authorities failed to

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restore peace the teachers' would build up a united movement against violence.

The meeting condemned Sunday's incident and expressed grave concern over the deterioration of law and order situation of the campus.

Teachers' also expressed deep sympathy to the members of the bereaved families.

The meeting resented police raid on some of the teachers' residence in absence of the teachers and demanded immediate arrest and trial of the persons responsible for Sunday's incident.

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
