Several hundred students of the college blocked the intersection around 11:30am, a major intersection in the city, also demanding autonomy of the college, transport and library facility, quality education, solution to accommodation problem,

Due to the tailback on the major roads, vehicles used several lanes and by-lanes to go to their destinations and, as a result, the narrow inner roads also witnessed severe gridlock.
