Edn UK Exhibition to strengthen ties Says British high commissioner

The 10th Education UK Exhibition 2008 began at Sheraton Hotel in the city yesterday.

University Grants Commission (UGC) Chairman Prof Nazrul Islam inaugurated the exhibition as chief guest.

He said Bangladeshi's 29 public universities and 51 private universities are not enough to provide higher education for all students.

"A large number of students have to go abroad for higher education and England is the best country for higher education. I expect these students will come back to their motherland after completing their higher edu-

tion abroad and will work for building better Bangladesh," he added.


Anwar Choudhury said this exhibition will strengthen the relationship between the UK and Bangladesh.
