

PM's call to BCL

Put her words into action

WE laud Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina's call to the BCL leaders and activists to prioritise education above all else, and stay away from the path of drugs, militancy and terrorism. The premier reinforced that the global menace of terrorism and militancy has no place in Islam, during a discussion on the occasion of the reunion of Bangladesh Chhatra League at Suhrawardy Udyan, marking its 69th founding anniversary. She also said that the government would take strong actions against those who misguide the country's youth.

We appreciate the Prime Minister's calls urging the BCL youths to the right path at a time when the country has seen itself being gripped by the claws of militancy and terrorism.
