No regular teacher in 4 yrs!

Faridpur Engineering College has been running without appointment of permanent teachers and staff since the opening of academic activities four years ago, much to the worry of students.

Established in 2010, the college started its academic activities in 2012. The teachers as well as most of the employees are serving on temporary basis, college sources said.

"The institution is being run by guest and temporary teachers since the beginning," Rjvi Ahmed, a second year student of civil engineering department of the college, said.

Teachers of Faridpur Polytechnic Institute and Government Rajendra College are taking classes since the opening of academic activities, he said.

The college was expected to run

three departments - electrical and electronic engineering, civil engineering, and computer and communica-

tion, said some students.

Though the first two departments

90 female students, in two depart-

The college has a building for bank post office and a cafeteria but they are yet to be opened. There is a library but it remains open only for two hours a
