

CU VC's residence attacked, teacher manhandled

CHITTAGONG, Nov 18 (UNB) : A meeting at the residence of Chittagong University Vice Chancellor today was abandoned in the face of brickbattering by a group of Shibir-backed students who had long been trying to force the Vice-Chancellor to resign.

Police and witnesses said a group of about 30 slogan shouting students stoned the two-storied house of Prof Alamgir Mohammad Sirajuddin when he was holding the meeting of the teacher's selection committee at

10 am. Shibir supporters scaled the boundary wall of VC's residence and damaged two vehicles parked in the premises. They were alleged to have manhandled Dr Enamul Haq, Head of the Department of Islamic History and Culture who was present at the meeting.

The Chittagong University reopened recently after about eight months of closure without the Vice Chancellor taking part in the day to day administration of the

campus.

Shibir-backed Sangrami Chhatra Oikkya has been demanding resignation of the Vice-Chancellor.

All Party Students Union (APSU), the opponents of the Shibir, later at a rally near new market in the city condemned the attack on VC's residence. Speakers at the rally demanded expulsion of the offenders from the university.

APSU has called for strike in the university tomorrow (Tuesday) when it will hold a rally in the morning at University Gate No. 1.

Sangrami Chharta Oikkya also held a separate rally in the campus today where speakers reiterated the demand for resignation of the Vice-Chancellor.
