

## JU students slam hall vacancy notice

JAHANGIRNAGAR Uni-  
versity students protest the  
university authorities' call  
to vacate the dormitories  
for fourteen days during the  
41-day long vacation which  
starts today.

On May 29, JU authorities  
issued a press release signed  
by JU deputy registrar (ad-  
ministration) Rahima Kaniz  
on this issue.

'On the occasion of sum-  
mer, Ramadan and Eid-ul-  
Fitr, all the dorms will remain  
closed from July 1-14, while  
the classes will resume on  
July 17,' the release said.

Terming the decision as  
'autocratic', Shafiqul Islam, a  
third year student of journal-  
ism and media studies de-  
partment said, 'It will hamper  
our academic activities as our  
final exam starts this month  
and will continue to July.'

'Sanatan Bidharthy  
Sangsad' president Robin  
Karmakar said, 'The hall va-  
cancy will bring immense  
sufferings to the students  
who have to stay at the hall  
due to unavoidable circum-  
stance.'

Dipanjana Sidhanta Kajol,  
president of JU unit Chhatra  
union, 'We will meet the VC  
and request him to cancel the  
decision.'

Contacted, the university  
registrar Abu Bakr said, 'The  
decision was taken at a syn-  
dicate meeting to conduct  
renovation works during the  
vacation.'
