

## Scrapped exams : Rule issued on DU VC

The High Court Division of the Supreme Court has issued two separate rules upon the Vice-Chancellor of Dhaka University and others to show cause as to why order of cancellation of B.A and B. Com (Pass) examinations of 1988 of Dhanbari Degree College centre, Tangail should not be declared to have been passed without any lawful authority and is of no legal effect.

The High Court also in the same rules asked them to show cause as to why directions should not be given to publish the results of the examinations of the centre.

Mr Mir Shafiqul Haque and Mr Abdur Razzaque and others filed two writ petitions challenging the validity of the order of cancellation of B.A and B.Com examinations of Dhanbari Degree College centre held in 1988. The petitioners were the examinees from the centre.

They stated in the writ petitions that the Controller of the Examinations of the Dhaka University by his order (dated December, 22, 1988) cancelled the examinations without showing any reason.

Upon hearing the Counsel of the petitioners the Writ Bench comprising Mr Justice Abdul Matin Khan Chowdhury and Mr Justice Naimuddin

Ahmed issued the rules last Sunday.
