

EUCSU polls

The elections of the Engineering University Central Students Union (EUCSU) and hall unions will be held today (Wednesday) after a long seven years. A total of 3232 BUET students will cast their votes to select seven members of EUCSU for which 33 candidates are contesting. All preparations have been made to hold the election peacefully. Casting of votes will start at the common room of residential halls at 8 a.m. and will continue till 1 p.m. The counting of votes will start at 3 p.m. Four panels have been contesting the EUCSU polls which include Bangladesh Jatiyatabadi Chhatra Dal, joint panel of Bangladesh Chhatra Union, and Bangladesh Chhatra League (Sultan), combined panel of CSAC and Islami Chhatra Shibir.

DUCSU polls today

The Dhaka University Central Students Union (DUCSU) and the hall elections will be held today (Wednesday) after a lapse of about seven years. The last DUCSU polls were held in 1982 but the committee was dissolved following imposition of Martial Law in the country on March 24, 1982.

One hundred and eighty-six candidates are contesting for 20 positions of DUCSU from nine separate panels. The main rivals are the Central Students Action Committee (CSAC) and the Jatiyatabadi Chhatra Dal (JCD).

The 14 students organisations constituting CSAC are competing the polls from a combined panel. Four separate panels were earlier submitted from the partners of CSAC on January 25. Eight organisations later withdrew their candidatures and returned to the CSAC.

Following are the major CSAC nominees:— Vice-President: Sultan Mohammed Mansoor Ahmed (Chhatra League S-R), General Secretary: Mostaq Hossain (Chhatra League M-N), Assistant General Secretary: Nasirudduza (Chhatra Union), Students Common Room: Mohiuddin Ahmed (Chhatra Moitri), Science Common Room Secretary: Abu Ali (Chhatra Union), Female Students Common Room Secretary: Aklima Sultana Lopa (Samajtantrik Chhatra Front), Social Welfare Secretary: Kaosar Molilah (Chhatra League S-R), Literary Secretary: Isteckbal Hossain (Chhatra League M-N), Sports Secretary: Shafiqul Islam Manik (a general nomination by all), Cultural Secretary: Ashok Taru Karmaker (Chhatra Union) and Transport Secretary: Wahiduzzaman Chand (Jatiya Chhatra League).

VC assures free, fair election

Prof. Abdul Mannan, the Vice-Chancellor of Dhaka University has assured a peaceful, fair and free DUCSU polls to be held today (Wednesday).

The Vice-Chancellor was addressing a crowded press conference at his residence on Tuesday evening.

Prof. Abdul Mannan said that after long seven years the students of Dhaka University are going to exercise their rights through DUCSU polls for bringing a better atmosphere on the campus. He assured that there would be no favouritism in connection with the polls. "To me everybody is my student, there is no party to me, no political identity", he added.

The Vice-Chancellor informed that 16 buses would ply throughout the day to bring the non-resident students on the campus. He said eight have been hired in this connection. He hailed the students of Dhaka University for maintaining peace on the campus during the campaign and sought further help to ensure a perfect polling.

The Vice-Chancellor remarked that through holding DUCSU polls peacefully students of Dhaka University would set an example of democratic practice. The Press Conference was also addressed by Prof. Ahsanul Huq, the Chief Returning

room where a good number of magazines, books, periodicals and sports goods, were kept for the students.

In 1953 DUCSU replaced DUSU which had failed to attain its objectives. After the formation of DUCSU it was decided that the Vice-Chancellor will be its President and he would nominate a teacher as the Treasurer. The other members will be elected through the direct polls of the general students.

Past recalled

The students of Dhaka University exercised their franchise in DUCSU polls in the academic year 1970-71. Earlier the office-bearers of DUCSU were elected by the members of hall unions.

The DUCSU polls of this year would be the 18th of its kind. The first Vice-President and General Secretary of DUCSU were late S.A. Bari A.T. and Julmat Ali Khan (Advocate) respectively.

The objectives of DUCSU are to help healthy development of intellect and cultural attainment of the students and to resolve various problems related to students. After the new University Ordinance was announced by the Government in 1973, five student representatives were nominated to the Senate, the highest decision-making body of the university.

Records show that DUCSU has had two women Vice-Presidents so far. The first woman Vice-President was Begum Jahanara Akter in 1960-61. Then in the academic year of 1966-67 Mahfuja Khanam was elected the Vice-President of DUCSU. Present Awami League Leader Begum Matia Chowdhury was the only woman, so far, elected as the General Secretary of DUCSU in the academic year of 1963-64.

The student organisations have already completed their preparations for the elections. The campus wore a festive look. The candidates decorated the campus with colourful banners, fastoons, posters and wall writings. The result of the polls will be announced tomorrow (Thursday).
