

Medical students asked to discard politics

HEALTH minister Moham-
mad Nasim on Saturday
urged medical students to
refrain from any kind of ac-
tive politics and instead, con-
centrate on study to become
highly rated doctors.

'You do not need to organ-

ise rallies.... you don't need to
chant slogans on the streets...
your prime duty is to devote
yourselves to the study to be
'first-class doctor,' he said.

He was speaking as chief
guest at an orientation pro-
gramme of the MBBS stu-
dents of 'K-97' batch at Dhaka
Medical College auditorium.

The minister told the stu-

dents, 'Think about the efforts
that your parents have been
putting on you...so it is your
sacred duty to make them
proud and happy.' Referring
to the rumours of question pa-
per leakage Nasim said, 'It was
a challenge for me to stand for
the meritorious students...this
year the medical and dental
admission tests in the public

and private sectors were held
in an atmosphere of high level
security and transparency.

Dental Council president Is-
