Ex-leaders confine IU BCL GS

Former leaders and activists of Islamic University unit Bangladesh Chhatra League kept its incumbent general secretary Rakibul Islam Rakib confined at university's administrative building over their internal conflict on Saturday.

Witnesses said there had been a longstanding dispute between IU unit BCL general secretary Rakib and its former assistant secretary Faisal Siddique Arafat over establishing supremacy on the campus.

A group of 50 activists, who did not get any post in the incumbent committee, led by Jubayer Rahman, came to the university's administrative building and kept him confined there from 2:00pm to 3:30pm.

Rakib came to the university's finance and banking department for taking part in his master examination viva-voce at around 12:00pm. After completion of his viva voce, he went to the university treasurer's office. Minutes after he entered into the treasurer's room, followers of Faisal went there to flex muscle and chanted slogans against Rakib.

On information, proctor Paresh Chandra Barman went to the spot and tried to bring the situation under control.

Later, Rakib left the campus with the assistance of the proctorial body around 3:50pm.

Rakib later said, 'the slogan they chanted were not acceptable as they declared to slaughter us wherever they get us. They cannot be activists of Chhatra League.'

Proctor Paresh Chandra told New Age that they would take stern action as part of the announcement of prime minister Sheikh Hasina if the feuding Chhatra League factions fail to solve their internal problem.

The former leaders and activists of Chhatra League also ousted its incumbent president SM Rabiul Islam Polash from the campus on October 12.
