The blossoms fill the air with colour and fragrance, as butterflies drift among the flowers and birds chirp from the surrounding trees.

The university's botanical garden, one of its key attractions, has also taken on a renewed charm, with roses, dahlias, chrysanthemums, cosmos and calendulas in full bloom. Each day, students and visitors gather there to soak in the seasonal beauty.

Spring also brings a renewed vibrancy to student life on campus. Amid their academic routines, many students spend time with friends along flower-lined pathways or in the gardens -- some taking photographs, others strolling around, while many simply pause to enjoy the quiet beauty of nature.
