

2 held over sale of 'fake' SSC question papers

THE Rapid Action Battalion has arrested two youths for their alleged involvement in a gang selling 'fake' Secondary School Certificate examination question papers through social media and online communication platforms in the capital's Kamrangirchar area.

The arrested are Md Sajedul Islam Saif, 24, and Tausif Rahman Risad, 23.

Addressing a press conference at Jatrabari Camp of RAB-10 on Thursday, its sadar company commander Sonali Sen said that the intelligence unit of RAB had recently received information about a group ac-

tive on social media who were misleading students and parents by spreading false propaganda regarding the SSC-2026 question paper leak to gain financial benefits.

A team of the company conducted a drive on Wednesday night and arrested the duo from Kamrangirchar area, she said, adding that four mobile phones and Tk 3,700 were seized from them during the drive, said Sonali.

Referring to primary interrogation, she described that the duo were working as an organised gang and opened Telegram groups named 'Bat Man Wild' and 'BATMAN' about six months ago and were trying to gain mon-

ey from students and parents through bKash by spreading rumours of the SSC-2026 exam question paper leak and sale on Facebook and Telegram.

The mobile phones used by the duo were seized and analysis of the digital devices had revealed evidence of such criminal activities, she said, adding that further legal proceedings against the duo were under way and an operation was also on-going to arrest other members involved in the gang.
