

# None of the 14,300 selected primary teacher candidates will be dropped: Education minister

Milon says appointment letters will be issued 'very soon'

Education Minister ANM Ehsanul Hoque Milon today confirmed that none of the 14,300 candidates selected in the primary teacher recruitment process will be dropped, though he did not specify when appointment letters would be issued.

“We are not dropping anyone,” Milon told reporters after the DC conference in Dhaka.

He said the recruitment process had already been completed through examinations, and the government was now following official procedures.

Pressed on the timing, he added that letters would be issued “very soon.”

## Primary teacher recruits stage sit-in at Shahbagh, demand appointment letters

Milon noted that the previous government had completed recruitment “hurriedly,” while the current administration was bringing the process “under discipline.”

He also said newly recruited teachers may be sent to Primary Training Institutes, where failure would disqualify them from permanent posts. Under government rules, teachers become permanent after two years of service.

Addressing the shortage, Milon said around 32,500 primary school headmaster posts remain vacant because of ongoing court cases. Recruitment will begin once the legal issues are resolved.

He added that 32,500 more teachers must be appointed later.

“In total, we need to recruit 77,000 teachers in the public system,” he said.
