Abu Hena dead

Noted educationist, researcher, poet and lyricist Dr Abu Hena Mostafa Kamal, Director General of Bangla Academy, died of heart attack at the Suhrawardy Hospital at 3.45 p.m. on Saturday. He was 53.

Dr Abu Hena was admitted to the hospital with pain in the chest on Tuesday evening. His condition deteriorated on Friday and remained unchanged till his death. He was in the intensive care unit of the hospital.

He left behind his widow, two sons, three daughters, a large number of students, friends, well-wishers and admirers to mourn his death.

His Namaj-e-Janaza will be held at the Dhaka University Central Mosque after Asr prayer today (Sunday).

Dr Abu Hena began his profession as a lecturer in Bangla in Pabna Edward College in 1959. He also served the same department in Chapainawabganj College and Rajshahi Government College.

Dr Abu Hena joined the Dhaka University Bangla Department as a lecturer in 1963. He joined the Rajshahi University Bangla Department as an



assistant professor in 1965 and was promoted to the position of associate professor in 1970. He joined the Chittagong University Bangla Department as an associate professor in 1970 and was promoted to the rank of professor in 1976. Finally he returned to the Dhaka University Bangla Department as a full fledged professor in 1978.

Dr Abu Hena joined Bangladesh Shilpakala Academy as its

Director General in 1984. He joined Bangla Academy as its Director General in 1986 and continued in the post till his death.

Dr Abu Hena received the "Bangla Academy Award," "Suhrid Shahitya Gosthi gold medal and "Alawol Award" for his contribution to the country's literary arena.

He is author of many books including "Shilpir Rupantar", "Apon Jouban Boiry", "Jehetu Janmandha" and "Akranta Ghazals".

Dr Abu Hena visited the UK France, USA and Japan and attended many conferences in those countries.

Late Dr Abu Hena was also a popular TV compere.

The body of the deceased was preserved in the BIRDEM cold room till the arrival of his eldest son Sujit Mostafa from Delhi.

Hailed from village Gobinda of Pabna district late Dr Abu Hena stood 13th in the entrance examination from Pabna Zila School in 1952. He also stood 7th in the HSC examination from Dhaka College in 1954 in humanities group.

Dr Abu Hena stood first class first in the B.A. Honours examination in 1958 from Dhaka University Bangla Department. He also stood first class first in the M.A. examination in 1959 from the same department. Then he completed his Ph.D. in 1969 from London University on "the Bengali press and literary writing".

A good number of Dhaka University teachers, journalists students, Bangla Academy officials and cultural activists rushed to late Dr Abu Hena's residence on Dhaka University campus to bid him good-bye.

Among others the Dhaka University Vice Chancellor Prof. Abdul Mannan, Pro Vice-Chancellor Prof. Emajuddin Ahmed Treasurer Prof. Abdullah Farook, Awami League leader Abdus Samad Azad, scientist Abdullah al-Muti Sarfuddin, Secretary in charge of Cultural Division Mr. Hamed Saiful Islam and Drama artiste Ramen du Majumder visited the deceased's residence on Saturday evening.
