

DUTA demands withdrawal of govt order

The Dhaka University Teachers Association (DUTA) has rejected the government order stopping appointments, promotions and upgradation of the posts of teachers, officers and employees in all the universities.

A general meeting of the DUTA members on Wednesday also called upon the university authorities to continue giving appointments defying the government order which it termed 'as illegal'. DUTA president Prof. Masihuzzaman chaired the meeting held at the Dhaka University Club.

The meeting also reiterated its demand for immediate withdrawal of the order.

DUCSU

The Dhaka University Central Students Union (DUCSU) has demanded withdrawal of the government order stopping appointments, promotions and upgradation of the posts of teachers, officers and employees in all the universities in the country.

Regarding the order, DUCSU Vice-President Sultan Mohammad Mansur Ahmed and General Secretary Mushtaq Hossain, in a statement on Wednesday said the order would seriously affect smooth running of the universities.
