Shortage of teachers in C'nawabganj College

CHAPAINAWABGANJ.

Sept 16 : Academic pursuit in Rohanpur Ushaf Ali College is being impeded due to shortage of teachers.

Nineteen posts of professors and lecturers have long been lying vacant in college causing immense irregularity in holding classes.

The number of sanctioned posts of teacher for the college

is 53. But only 34 teachers are serving in the college for about 1500 students.

Due to shortage of teachers adequate classes cannot be provided to the students up to the mark. Many scheduled classes remain unattended whenever one or two teachers go on leave.

The college is financially solvent enough to pay salary to the teachers. Despite that the college authority is indifferent to appointing teachers against vacant posts.

Besides, about a year ago, the governing body of the college took a decision to open two new departments for history and social science but it was implemented.

A five-day training course on Extended Programme of Immunisation (EPI) was held at Chapainawabganj under the auspices of Sadar Upazila Health and Family Planning Department.

A total of 25 males and females participated in the course. The course was aimed at checking infantile mortality and making mothers aware of pre-and post natal diseases.
