Teachers urged to give proper edn to students

SATKHIRA, June 30:—Education Minister Sk. Shahidul Islam called upon the parents to provide proper atmosphere to their children so that they can get light of civilization.

He was addressing a big gathering at Rasulpur High School premises recently under Satkhira Pourashava on the occasion of foundation-laying ceremony of Rasulpur High School. He said that the students had their own virtue and wisdom which should properly be developed to build them worthy citizens. He reminded the parents and teachers of their responsibilities towards their wards. He stressed the need for congenial atmosphere in the institutions all over the country. He urged upon the real path of education for eradicating the illiteracy from the society at any cost to produce worthy citizen to shoulder the future national responsibilities.
