Top priority given to education sector

RAJSHAHI, May 30: The present government has adopted several pragmatic steps aimed at spreading education in the country, reports UNB.

State Minister for Establishment Barrister Aminul Haque said this on Friday while addressing the inaugural function of Moyeenpur Junior High School new building as chief guest in Tanore

thana of the district.

The overall development would not be achieved keeping behind the vast masses illiterate in the country, the State Minister said adding this is why the government had attached top most priority to the education sector.

Barrister Haque said under the development scheme of the government a large number of schools are being constructed and rehabilitated to implement different education program.

For female education the government had introduced free studentship and scholarship system for the girls students from class six to ten. An educated mother only can play a vital role to help build the future generation properly, he said.

Emphasising the need for creating mass awareness to participate in the tree plantation programme Mr. Haque called upon the people to plant saplings in all fellow lands of the Barind area to protect desertification and environmental pollution in the northern region of the country.

The meeting chaired by President of Moyeenpur Junior High School Managing Committee Ali Afzal, was addressed among others by Prof Dr. Mozammel Haque of Rajshahi University, said a PID handout Saturday.

Earlier, Mr Haque visited some educational institutions to inspect their condition.
