Teachers urged to help check unfairmeans in examinations

Vice-Chancellor of the state-run universities at a meeting on higher education in Dhaka on Tuesday urged the teachers to help check adoption of unfairmeans in examinations, reports BSS.

Presiding over the meeting, Education Minister A.S.H.K. Sadique said the teachers would have to come forward to develop the classroom teaching as well as to improve the teacher-student relations which will ultimately help reduce copying in examinations.

The Minister said monthly review of the progress of studies can also discourage the student in adopting unfairmeans in examinations.

Chairman of the Parliamentary Standing Committee on Ministry of Education Nurul Islam Nahid, Education Secretary Kazi Raqibuddin Ahmed, Chairman of the University Grants Commission Dr. Nazrul Islam and all Vice-Chancellor were present.

Earlier, the Minister asked the Chairman and Controllers of the country's Education boards to stop mass copying in the ongoing Higher Secondary Certificate (HSC) examinations in some centres.

The Minister expressed satisfaction over the fair examinations in comparison to the past, according to reports submitted by the Board Chairman.

Mr. Sadique directed the concerned authorities to take strong actions against some centres, including Daulatpur Degree College of Kushtia, Khas Mothurapur of Bheramara and Cheora Government College of Comilla.
