BFTA to submit 15-pt memorandum today

The teachers of both government and non-government schools and colleges will submit a 15-point memorandum and seven-point recommendations to the Prime Minister across the country to the Thana Nirbahi Officers (TNO) today (Thursday) under the banner of Bangladesh Federation of Teachers' Association (BFTA).

separate Public Service Commission for the non-government teachers, promotion for both government and non-government teachers, improvement of the libraries and laboratories, allocation of government money in the educational institutions on the basis of number of students and withdrawal of land taxes on the educational institutions, full resumption of the teachers' trust fund (non-government) etc. The seven-point recommendations aims at checking of unfairmeans at the public examination which include establishment of a national public examination institute that would provide training to all connected with examination, examiners, invigilators, question papers setters, tabulators, etc.

Sheikh Amanullah and Principal Kazi Faruque Ahmed, Chairman and Secretary General respectively of BFTA, Principal A.K.M. Zahirul Islam, President, Bangladesh College Teachers' Association, Principal Ali Akbar Khan, President Bangladesh Government College Teachers' Council Md. Selim Bhuiya, Secretary General, Bangladesh Teachers' Association and Md. Toha, Secretary General Bangladesh Government Secondary Teachers' Association in a joint statement called upon the teachers at thana level throughout the country to follow the programmes in a befitting manner.
