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Dhaka Board's Clarification

The Dhaka Education Board after consultation with experts in geography and mathematics has given explanations in some news regarding two questions of SSC geography and mathematics in order to remove misunderstanding from the public mind, reports BSS.

In an official handout the Board said that the mistake in the question No. 3 in geography (compulsory) as mentioned in the newspapers had been placed before the geography experts who opined that because the sum has mentioned both the standard time and the hemisphere so there was no dearth of necessary facts to find the solution to the sum. Both the places were in eastern hemisphere and the standard time of both the places had been given. So it was possible to find out the longitude of the places, it said.

In the mathematics (compulsory) question No. 9 (e) the Board said that the sum had mentioned two conditions on the basis of which the solution to the sum could be found, according to experts in mathematics. It said as the sum had mentioned the condition that $(A+B+C)$ is greater than 0. Therefore there was no necessity of mentioning it again. Moreover, the same question had also been set in the 1986 SSC examination and at that time none had raised any objection to it or complained about it, the handout added.
