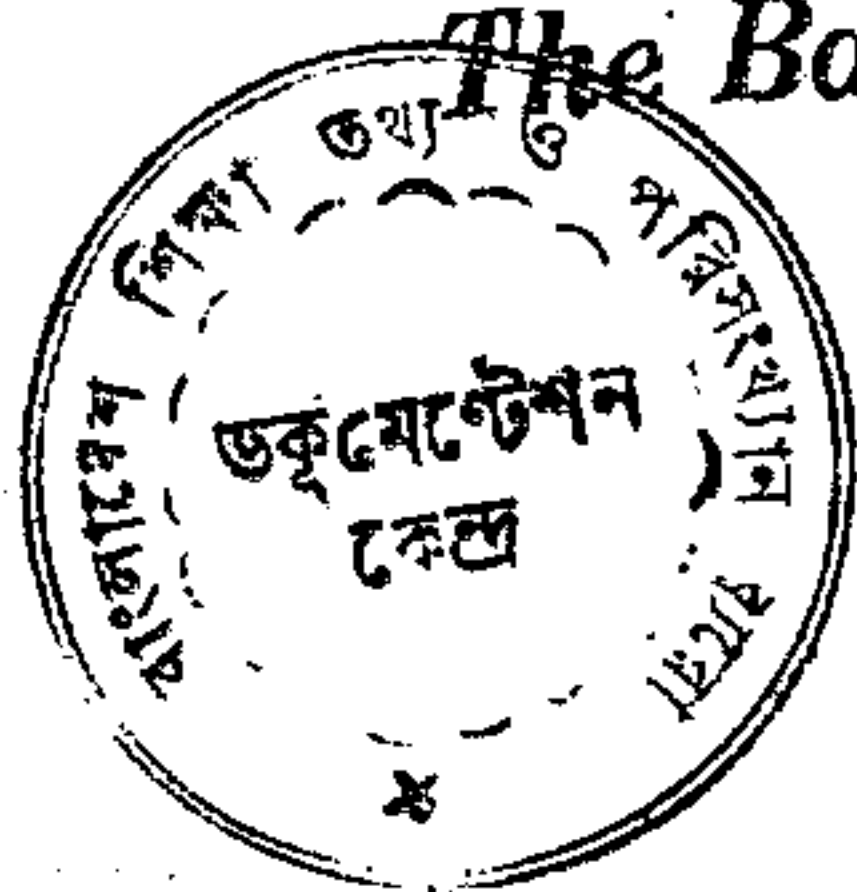

Ali Amjad School in doldrums

MAULVIBAZAR, Mar. 18:—The Ali Amjad Government Girls' High School at Maulvibazar had been catering to the need of female education for some decades since its inception in the British period. The school is now beset with manifold problems.

There are about 900 students on the roll of the school. But the number of teachers is only 15.

There is no assistant headmistress in the school. The Headmistress is under order of transfer with no prospect of a new one to fill up the vacancy. It is not conceivable how a high school runs without Headmis-

tress and an Assistant Headmistress. The shortage of teachers is acute the classes are dimised after the recess. Eleven posts of teachers are vacant.

The school building was damaged in 1975 and classes were shifted to hostel where accommodation problem has become acute. There is no common room for the students.

The existing tubewell can hardly meet the requirements. Moreover it goes out of order every now and then.

Absence of transport facilities is also causing much difficulties to the student. The school bus, which had gone out of order a decade back, has not been repaired.

The latrines of the school is in a diplorable condition which needs early renovation.
