Kurigram college facing fund constraints

KURIGRAM, Nov. 4:—Majeeda Adarsha College established at the private initiatives has been facing numerous bottlenecks which are eating into the vitals of the institution.

The only higher secondary standard private college in Kurigram zila headquarters cannot admit required number of students for want of accommodation.

Most of the class rooms lack requisite number of benches. The students hurdle together in the class-rooms.

There is no science laboratory in the college. The science students are deprived of practical classes. Besides, the teachers do not get monthly salary regularly due to fund constraints.

There are 14 teachers including four demonstrators in the college. Besides, there are 10 non-teaching staff and a Principal working in the college.

The college did not get govt. grant except Taka 5,00,000 in the last financial year. Moreover, Mayeedul Islam gave Taka 2,00,000 from his

personal fund last year.

There is no library and the students are deprived of reading. Scarcity of sports equipment is another vexing problem for the students.

There is no common room either for teachers or students. The students loiter here and there during leisure period.

Knowledgeable circle opined that with a view to overcoming the bottlenecks of the college it is urgently needed introduction of degree course.
