jective news.

They said the journalist community is pledge-bound to publish objective news and they are uncompromising in this regard. But some speeches at a rally of All-Party Students Unity (APSU) were tantamount to interference into the freedom of press and the freedom of expression.

They said if the rights of any organisation or individual are affected by any news item, the organisation or individual may file complaints with the Press Council as per the democratic norms. They said such issues should be solved through the institutional methods and not through threats. They hoped all will abide by the democratic rules.

The journalist leaders said tolerance and mutual respect are of urgent need at this critical juncture of the nation and appealed for cooperation of all political parties, students and professionals.
