## DU getting warmed up with poll rallies

Dhaka University campus is getting warmed up with processions, rallies and slogans in connection with the DUCSU and hall unions elections scheduled to be held on July 31, reports BSS.

Hundreds of supporters and activists of different student organisations on Sunday brought out processions and held rallies on the campus calling upon the students to vote for their respective organisations.

Bangladesh Chhatri League (A-A) brought out a procession and later held a rally at the Modhu's Canteen premises. BCL leaders demanded of the government and the university authorities to take necessary steps to bring to book the "culprits" who, they said, have been "expelled earlier from the university". The BCL leaders also alleged that armed hoodlums were staying in different halls under the patronisation of ruling party backed student wing JCD.

They also demanded immediate release of their detained activists including Moazzem Hossain and withdrawal of "false cases" against their activists. The rally was addressed by Shah Alam, Qamruzzaman Ansari and Golam Mustafa Sujon.

Bangladesh Jatiyatabadi Chhatri Dal (JCD) brought out a procession and held a rally at the DUCSU Bhaban premises. The rally was addressed by Moniruzzaman Munir, Habibul Islam Habib and Ali Akkas Nadim.

JCD leaders called upon the

students to vote for the JCD to free the campus from arms and violence. They also urged student community to boycott Chhatri League (A-A) in the forthcoming DUCSU polls, if it did not expel the killers of Dr Shamsul Alam Khan Milon.

The JCD leaders also demanded of the university authorities to withdraw the expulsion order of Kamruzzaman Ratan, Elias Ali and Abdul Malek, who were earlier expelled from the university in 1987 on charges of their involvement in campus violence.

Bangladesh Chhatri League (N-S), Bangladesh Chhatri Federation, Bangladesh Chhatri Moitri, Jatiya Chhatri League also brought out separate processions on the campus or vote for their respective organisations.
