

Vehicles damaged, many injured

Police jeep hits procession

The Chhatra League (A-A) workers on Tuesday went on rampage in the city and set ablaze at least four vehicles and damaged about 50 others including a police van after a police jeep had hit a Chhatra League procession from behind at the Bangabandhu Avenue injuring one seriously.

Besides, at least 30 persons including a photo journalist of The Morning Sun were injured when police resorted to lathicharge and fired teargas shells to disperse the agitating supporters of Chhatra League. Police also picked up six Chhatra League leaders and workers including Kamruzzaman Ansari, General Secretary of organisation's Dhaka University Unit.

Chhatra League members set ablaze a Microbus (Dhaka-metro-Cha 7790) at the Nilkhet crossing and two others (SUS-65-3327 and SUS-65-3264) at the British Council Library premises and a motor cycle (Dhaka-metro-a-01-9074) near Jagannath Hall yesterday morning in protest against the arrest of their leaders and workers.

Some unruly students also damaged five other vehicles inside the British Council. Later, Chhatra League held a rally in front of the Jatiya Press Club at about 11.30 am demanding immediate release of their leaders and workers including Liaquat and Masum.

The rally over, Chhatra League brought out a procession when

the procession came near Zero point a police van which was following the procession, hit the procession leaving a Chhatra League member injured.

The victim of the police van was identified as Babul, General Secretary of City College unit of the organisation. His leg was badly bruised, attending doctors said.

Following the incident, the Chhatra League supporters became violent and started damaging vehicles parked at Gulistan and plying through the area. According to eyewitnesses, police this time, resorted to indiscriminate lathicharge and lobbed several rounds of teargas shells to disperse the violent processionists.
