Press Note

Body to probe City College incident

The Government had formed a one-man commission to inquire into the causes of the total incidents, and find out responsibility and make necessary recommendations relating to the unpleasant incidents of (Monday) and (Sunday) in Dhaka City College area, according to a Press Note on Monday, reports BSS.

Besides, Officer in-charge of Dhanmandi Thana has also been suspended, the Press Note issued by the Home Ministry said.

The Senquiry Commission was formed with Mohammad Hamidul Haq, District and Sessions judge of Comilla.

The Press Note also said the commission was asked to submit its recommendations within ten days on the clashes between the police and the students of the Dhaka City College and the Ideal College (both near Science laboratory) that took place on January 13.

The Press Note said "Some unpleasant incidents took place yesterday (Sunday) and today (Monday) concerning an unfortunate incident near the Dhaka City College on January 13. A delegation of the All-Party Students Unity met with the Home Secretary to discuss the matters relating to the overall situation. The delegation included 1. Khairul Kabir Khokan, 2.
