Hasina urged to pull out her 'terror brigade' from DU

DUCSU leaders Saturday called upon Awami League chief Sheikh Hasina to pull out her "terror brigade" from Dhaka University for restoring academic atmosphere on the campus, reports UNB.

They said three factions of the pro-Awami League Chhatra League had been involved in campus violence for long, disrupting regular academic activity of the university.

The DUCSU call came from an anti-terrorism students gathering it arranged in front of the Jatiya Press Club Saturday afternoon as part of the drive launched against the vice from the recent Convention.

Presided over by DUCSU VP Amanullah Aman, MP the rally

was addressed, among others, by DUCSU General Secretary Khairul Kabir Khokon, AGS Nazimuddin Alam, DU Senate member and Jatiyatabadi Chhatra Dal Joint Convenor Fazlul Huq Milon, DU Senate member Moniruzzaman Monir, JCD central leaders Abul Khair Bhuiyan, Abdul Malek, Moshtarraf Hossain Thakur, Ilyas Ali, DUCSU member Shahiduddin Chowdhury Anee and Rokeya Hall Union VP Shirin Sultana.

The leaders of Dhaka University Central Students Union (DUCSU) and of the student wing of ruling BNP apprehended fresh bloodshed anytime as the rival factions of BCL remained entrenched in battle preparation, exchanging gunfire at intervals.

Amanullah Aman urged Sheikh Hasina, also Leader of the Opposition in Parliament, to purge the "terrorists" from her party's student wing and control the troublemakers.

He also urged the Prime Minister to convene an all-party meeting of political leaders again and called upon all to come forward to resist violence in the greater interest of democracy.

The DUCSU VP-cum-lawmaker warned of launching a social movement against those out to destroy democracy and hamper peace and development.

"DUCSU is not part of the government. We will protest if the government takes undemocratic steps," said DUCSU GS Khokon
