Rajshahi Govt College, Barisal B M College closed sine die

RAJSHAHI, Dec. 22: Rajshahi Government College has been closed sine die this evening following a violent clash between supporters of Islami Chhatra Shibir and All Party Student Unity and JCD. The clash left 50 injured, 10 of them seriously.

The clash originated, according to eye witnesses, when

Shibir activists attacked a JCD procession on the college campus this morning. The situation has been tense since early this month following Shibir's demand to amend the list of students selected for admission to HSC classes. Shibir activists allegedly put the administrative office of the college under lock and key since December 2 last to press home their demands.

Being attacked by the Shibir activists, JCD and all party students unity made counter attacks and both sides were locked in a bloody clash. Both sides allegedly used cut rifles, explosives and sticks during the clash.

The seriously injured persons were admitted to Rajshahi Medical College Hospital. Ten of them were operated upon.

A group of students ransacked at least 10 rooms at students hostel in the afternoon. When Shibir supporters brought out a procession in the city, JCD and APSU, allegedly, attacked them.

The seriously injured students include: Ibrahim Khalil, Prince, Mahabubul, Ahsan, Salahuddin, Abdul Wahed, Shamsul Islam, Masud, Shafiu Huq, Hasanuzzaman, Shahngr and Shahin.

UNB from Barisal B M College was closed sine die yesterday following a post-election violence.

Campus sources said a group of students went on rampage damaging furnitures and windowpanes at the college after the announcement of election results this (Tuesday) morning.

The election for the college union was held on Monday. BCL candidate AM Mesbauddin Juel was elected Vice President defeating his nearest rival from Jatiyatabadi Chhatra Dal (JCD).

The Awami League backed Chhatra League swept the polls winning 18 seats out of the total of 26.
