Call to identify mass literacy bottlenecks

The National Council for Mass Literacy met in Dacca on Tuesday with Vice President Mr Justice Abdus Sattar in the chair to discuss various issues relating to spread of Mass literacy in the country reports BSS. The Council in its three-hour deliberations discussed in depth various problems on mass literacy and considered measures to remove the curse of illiteracy from the country at the earliest.

Addressing the meeting, the Vice-President underscored the urgency of eradicating illiteracy and pointed out that the bottlenecks standing in the way of mass literacy need to be identified.
