Govt trying to remove illiteracy : Biswas

President Abdur Rahman Biswas today said the present democratic government has been trying its best to remove illiteracy and alleviate poverty from the country, reports UNB.

President Biswas was talking to a 19-member delegation of Patuakhali Waizia Alia (Dakhil) Madrasa and Waizlabad Mostafabia Alia (Fazil) Madrasa in Patuakhali district when they called on him at Bangabhaban on Tuesday.

The delegation was led by Secretary of the institutions Moulana Shah Mohammad Nizamul Haq.

Our economic backwardness is due to illiteracy in the country, Biswas said adding that without mass literacy no sustainable economic development is possible.
