



CSAC submits memorandum to Text Book Board Chairman

The Central Students Action Council (CSAC) handed over a memorandum to the Chairman, Bangladesh Text Book Board, Dhaka, protesting what it termed "conspiracy to hand over the secondary education to private sector."

Addressing a brief rally near the Text Book Board office at Motijheel, the CSAC leaders Nasiruddoza, Habibur Rahman Habib and Bazlur Rashid Firoze demanded elimination of anomalies regarding some text books in the secondary level.

Bangladesh Jatiyatabadi Chhatra Dal (JCD) staged demonstration near the Home Ministry on Wednesday and submitted a memorandum demanding trial of the killers of Milan and immediate release of all student detainees including the JCD leader Sanaul Huq Niru.

The demonstration was followed by a brief rally which was addressed among other by the JCD central leaders Asaduzzaman Ripon, Ananullah Aman, Nazimuddin Alam and Gautam Mitra.

The Dhaka University and its adjoining areas were peaceful on Wednesday barring a stray incident in which a student of Dhaka College was assaulted in front of the college canteen.

Khandaker Ahmadul Huq, a first year BA student of the college who was a worker of Jatiyatabadi Chhatra Dal (JCD) was mercilessly beaten up by supporters of opponent student organisation at around 11:30 am on the day. He was given first aid at the Dhaka Medical College Hospital (DMCH).

Meanwhile, the roads in and around the Dhaka University campus were closed for the traffic for the sixth consecutive day on Wednesday. However, no untoward incident occurred.
