## FBUTA calls strike Aug 8 Teachers Assoc condemn terrorism in JU

The Federation of Bangladesh University Teachers Association (FBTA) at a meeting on Saturday strongly condemned the attack on Jahangirnagar University Teachers and destruction of the offices of V-C and other teachers by a group of armed students on Thursday.

The meeting in a resolution urged the government to form a judiciary inquiry committee to hold a probe into the incident within the next 72 hours.

Chaired by FBTA President Prof. Khandaker Mustahidur Rahman, the

meeting expressed solidarity with the programme of Jahangirnagar University Teachers' Association (JUTA) and urged the authorities concerned to punish the terrorists.

The meeting expressed resentment against the silent role of the Law enforcing agencies and said that it was possible to protect the anarchy if necessary steps were taken earlier.

The meeting announced an action programme which include wearing black badges by members of FBTA on August 1 to 7, and bringing out procession and observance of day long token strike on August 8.

The Dhaka University Teachers Association (DUTA) at a meeting on Saturday demanded arrest and punishment of the 21 students of Jahangirnagar University against whom the university authorities filed case for their involvement in the attack on teachers on Thursday.

The meeting, presided over by DUTA President K.M. Mohsin in the chair, demanded formation of a inquiry committee to probe into the incident and expressed solidarity with the programmes of JUTA and Federation of Bangladesh University Teachers' Association.

gineering and Technology (BUET) Teachers' Association at a meeting with its president Prof. Md. Abdur Razzak Akand in the chair expressed indignation at the attack on Jahangirnagar University teachers and destruction of the universities by some unruly elements.

Shareeful Islam, Secretary General of National Federation of Teachers' Association (NFTA) in a statement on Saturday expressed his indignation at the attack on Jahangirnagar University Teachers including the President of Bangladesh Federation of University Teachers Association Prof. Mustahidur Rahman and NFTA President Prof. Enamul Haq Khan and Vice-Chancellor Prof. Kazi Saleh Ahmad and destruction of university properties by some unruly elements.

Bangladesh College Teachers Association president Zahirul Islam, General Secretary Kazi Faruque Ahmed, Treasurer Badiuzzaman and Joint Secretary Anadul Haq and Office Secretary Abdur Rab Mia demanded immediate arrest of the armed activists who assaulted the Jahangirnagar University teachers. They urged all to resist armed terrorism on the campus.
