SSC, Dakhil examinations date shifted to April 7

The government Saturday decided to shift the date of Secondary School Certificate (SSC) and Dakhil Examinations of 1996 from March 28 to April 7, reports BSS.

The decision was taken at a meeting held at the conference room of the Education Ministry on the holding of SSC and

Dakhil Examinations with Education Minister Barrister Rafiqul Islam Mia in the chair.

A total of five lakh 53 thousand candidates will sit for SSC and Dakhil Examinations this year in 1045 centres all over the country.

The meeting reviewed the prevailing situation in the country and unanimously decided that the examinations will have to be completed by April 25 before the holy Eid-ul-Azha.

The meeting observed that with a view to holding the examinations on April 7 necessary arrangements should be made so that sending of admit cards of the candidates, answer scripts, question papers and

related materials as well as movement of the concerned teachers, officials of the education boards and other government officials engaged in conducting the examination could be ensured from April 1.

The meeting sought cooperation of the people particularly the leaders of all political parties, teachers, guardians, students and the concerned officials and employees in safe movement of the examination materials and concerned personnel as well as in the peaceful conduct of the examinations in the greater interest of the nation and welfare of the candidates.
