

Canal digging goes apace in Kushtia

KUSHTIA, April 17:—The second phase of canal digging programme on voluntary basis is progressing quite steadily in Kushtia. Giving details of the programme Mr. Abdul Mannan Bhuiyan, Deputy Commissioner said that so far 29 canals under Kushtia, Meherpur and Chuadanga Subdivisions had been taken up under this programme. The canals when completed will bring an area of 51,845 acres of land under wheat and paddy cultivation. The work will involve 17,909,687 cft earth work.

The Deputy Commissioner said that so far 7,29,70,446 cft. earth work had been done. It means that 40.74 per cent work has already been completed.

The Deputy Commissioner further said that last year 12 projects with a total length of 64.67 miles were completed. It involved 10,13,38,708 cft earth work.

It benefited a total of 38,850 acres of land.

The Deputy Commissioner extolled the roles of different voluntary and youth organisations, students and teachers of different schools, Madrassahs and colleges in the canal digging programme.
