

S.S.C./H.S.C. Results

Sir,

I fully endorse the views of Mr. Kazi Sakhwat Hossain of Khulna and Mr. Md. Addul Latif Khalifa of Jessore and disagree with the opinions of Mr. M.S. Khurshid of Feni. Mr. Khurshid has cited the example of Comilla Victoria College where 'Engineering Drawing and Workshop Practice' is taught. This is an exceptional case. The pertinent question is in how many prominent colleges is this subject taught? In Jessore Board, there is none. The top two or three cadets can easily secure 200 marks in this subject whereas it is extremely difficult even to secure more than 170 marks in Biology. Moreover examination scripts of cadet colleges are examined by experienced senior teachers of prominent colleges.

It is, therefore, suggested that a separate Education Board named, Cadet Education Board be set up for Cadet Colleges, Cantment Colleges, Shaheen Colleges. Alternatively the privileged subject be taught in general schools and colleges and examination centres for Cadet Colleges, Cantment Colleges, Shaheen Colleges be changed and the system of mentioning of their

examination roll numbers as C-1, C-2, etc. be abolished in order to assess the true merit of the candidates in the public examinations.
