

Comilla Board SSC marksheet forged

COMILLA, Jan. 19.—Sale of forged mark-sheets of H.S.C. Examinations of BISE Comilla was revealed following complaint made to the Education Secretary by two victims of forgery. Messars Nazrul Islam and Abul Kalam of village Khalsa under Gopalganj Upazila of Sylhet district. Some Board employees are suspected to be involved in the racket.

The Board authority referred the matter to District Anti-Corruption Bureau for the investigation.

Nazrul Islam and Md. Abul Kalam appeared in the H.S.C. Examinations from Chandian Redwan Ahmed College in 1985. A few forth class employee of the BISEC made arrangement for them to appear in the examination from the College in lieu of money.

In the results sheet the results of Nazrul Islam Roll Chandian 661 science groups and Abul Kalam Roll Chandina 381 Science group were shown to have been withheld (vide result sheet page No. 44 and 45). The two examinees contacted the employees who assured them to have their results released.

After few days, they same employees gave them two mark sheets (serial No. 32923 and 32921) which showed that Abul Kalam passed in Second Division by securing 320 marks and Nazrul Islam in Third Division by securing 350 marks. Abul Kalam and Nazrul when approached Redwan Ahmed College for testimonials the mark sheets were detected to be forged, ones.

Abul Kalam and Nazrul Islam alleged that the employees of BISEC

realised Taka 60,000 from them for the mark sheets and when they asked him to return the money they threatened them of dire consequences.

The District administration formed an one-member enquiry committee with Mrs. Rita Sen, First Class Magistrate following an instruction from the Education Ministry the has atread begun work but could not yet complete the enquiry for want of the applicants.

Abul Kalam, according to a police report from Gopalganj, left with his parents for abroad. According to a report of the UNO, Gopalganj Nazrul Islam could not out be traced at his address. The District Anti-Corruption Bureau when asked by the enquiry Committee also stated that no headway could be made for want of the complainants.

The enquiry committee took the statement of the signing officer, showed in the forged mark sheets who denied that the signature was not of his own.

The employee Mr. Mohd. Ali, a record supplier alleged to has been involved in the racket and he denied to have involvement with the forgery and also to have any connection with the complainants.

It is believed that some fourth class employees have been extorting money from the examinees for increasing their numbers during tabulation etc. Not only mark sheets are forged forged certificates are also available.
