

# 46.15pc pass in SSC exams

The overall percentage of pass in the Secondary School Certificate (SSC) examinations of 1985 under the four education boards is 46.15, according to the results announced simultaneously in Dhaka on Thursday.

A total of 3,19,541 candidates had appeared at the examinations from the Dhaka, Comilla,

Rajshahi and Jessore Boards this year. Of them 1,47,465 came out successful—21,514 of them were placed in First Division, 93,645 in Second Division and 32,306 in Third Division.

Last year a record 4,01,247 candidates had appeared at the examinations from the four boards and 2,30,329 had come out successful, the percentage of pass being 57.40. 1984 was the last normal session for the candidates appearing in the traditional course having half a dozen groups.

This year students reading in the bi-track new SSC course;

and the drop-outs and those who failed in the traditional course examinations of 1984 were allowed to appear together. The appearance of a record number of candidates at the examinations last year is attributed to the fact that all previous drop-outs and failure cases had their last try.

## BOARDWISE

This year the percentages of pass varied widely among the four education boards. The percentage of pass was highest (51.38) in Comilla Board followed by 46.20 in Jessore Board, 45.85 in Rajshahi Board and 41.76 in Dhaka Board, according to the results.

## MALE: FEMALE

The male candidates appeared to have done better than female candidates in all the boards. In the three boards of Rajshahi, Comilla and Dhaka the percentage of pass of male candidates stood at 47 per cent and that of female candidates 43.99. Sexwise distribution of candidates was not shown in the results of the Jessore Board.

In these three boards a total of 1,75,347 male candidates appeared and 82,414 came out suc-

Sadeqa Tamanna of Bogra Govt. Girls' High School who stood second in Rajshahi Board secured the fourth highest (862) marks among the students of the four boards.

Rezwanul Kabir who stood first in the combined merit list of Dhaka Board was the fifth highest marks (860) scorer among the students of the four boards.

Md. Manzur Morshed who stood first in Comilla Board securing a total of 839 marks was the 15th highest marks scorer among all the students of the four education boards.

Cadet Kazi Nazrul Islam (Dipu) bearing roll number Sylhet Cadet-1 stood fourth in the combined merit list of Comilla Board. He secured 829 marks with five letters. He is the youngest son of Kazi Abdul Matin Deputy Manager of Fenchuganj Fertilizer Factory and Mrs. Tafura Matin. He desires to be a defence officer.

Jasmine Rahman stood fourth in the combined list and first among the female candidates of Dhaka Board.

successful — 13,031 being placed in First Division, 52,908 in Second Division and 16,908 in Third Division. Of the total 70,943 female candidates in these three boards, 31,207 passed — 3,388 in First Division, 19,808 in Second Division and 8,011 in Third Division.

#### OLD: NEW

It appeared that on an average candidates appearing in the bi-track new course fared slightly better than those who appeared in the multiple-track old course. The respective percentages of pass being 46.67 and 45.51 in the boards of Dhaka, Rajshahi and Comilla taken together. Again breakdown of candidates appearing in the two courses from Jessore Board was not worked out.

In these three boards a total of 1,35,176 candidates appeared at the examination in the new course and 63,092 came out successful. Of them 14,359 were

in First Division, 40,491 in Second Division and 8,243 in Third Division. Compared to that a total of 1,11,024 candidates had appeared in the old (traditional) course and 50,529 passed the examinations with 2,061 in First Division, 32,225 in Second Division and 16,243 in Third Division.

It is of interest to note here that in the boards of Dhaka and Rajshahi, students appearing in the old course did better than those appearing in the new course. The percentages of pass in Dhaka Board was 41.04 for new candidates in the new course and 42.62 for those in the old course. Similarly in Rajshahi Board the percentages of pass were 44.88 for students appearing in the new course and 46.92 for those who appeared in the old course.

In Comilla Board, however, students appearing in the new course had a higher percentage (53.91) of pass than those appearing in the old course (47.35).

#### DHAKA

In Dhaka Board out of a total of 95,484 candidate, 39,884 came out successful. Of them 6,636 were in First Division, 25,893 in Second Division and 7,355 in Third Division.

In this board the first three positions in the combined merit list went to students of Mirzapur Cadet College. Rezwanul Kabir of this college secured the first place securing a total of 860 marks with letter marks in five papers.

#### COMILLA

Out of a total of 76,725 candidates who appeared at the examinations from Comilla Board 38,553 passed 5,486 of them were in First Division, 25,960 in Second Division and 7,117 in Third Division.

In Comilla Board the first two positions in the combined merit list were occupied by students of Chittagong Collegiate School. Md. Manzur Morshed secured the first position obtaining a total of 839 marks and letter marks in four papers.

#### RAJSHAHI

In Rajshahi Board 35,184 out of a total of 76,725 candidates passed the examination. Of them 4,297 were placed in First Division, 20,873 in Second Division and 10,014 in Third Division.

In this board the first position went to the student of Rajshahi Cadet College and the second position to one from the Bogra Govt. Girls' High School. Md. Moniruzzaman of Rajshahi Cadet College who got the first place secured a total of 867 marks and had to his credit letter marks in six papers.

#### JESSORE

A total of 33,844 candidates out of 73,251 in Jessore Board came out successful in the examinations. Of them 5,095 were in First Division 20,929 in Second Division and 7,820 in Third Division.

The first 14 positions in the combined merit list of this board were occupied by students from the Jhenidah Cadet College. Abul Hassan Mohammad Bashar who secured the first position secured a total of 879 marks with letter marks in six papers including English.
