

# 67.58 pc pass Dhaka Board SSC exam

The results of the Secondary School Certificate (SSC) examination held this year under Dhaka Education Board was announced on Monday.

A total of 1,48,003 candidates appeared at the examination and 1,00,027 came out successful showing a percentage of success at 67.58.

Of the successful candidates 19,023 were placed in the first division, 45,456 in the second division and 35,548 were placed in the third division.

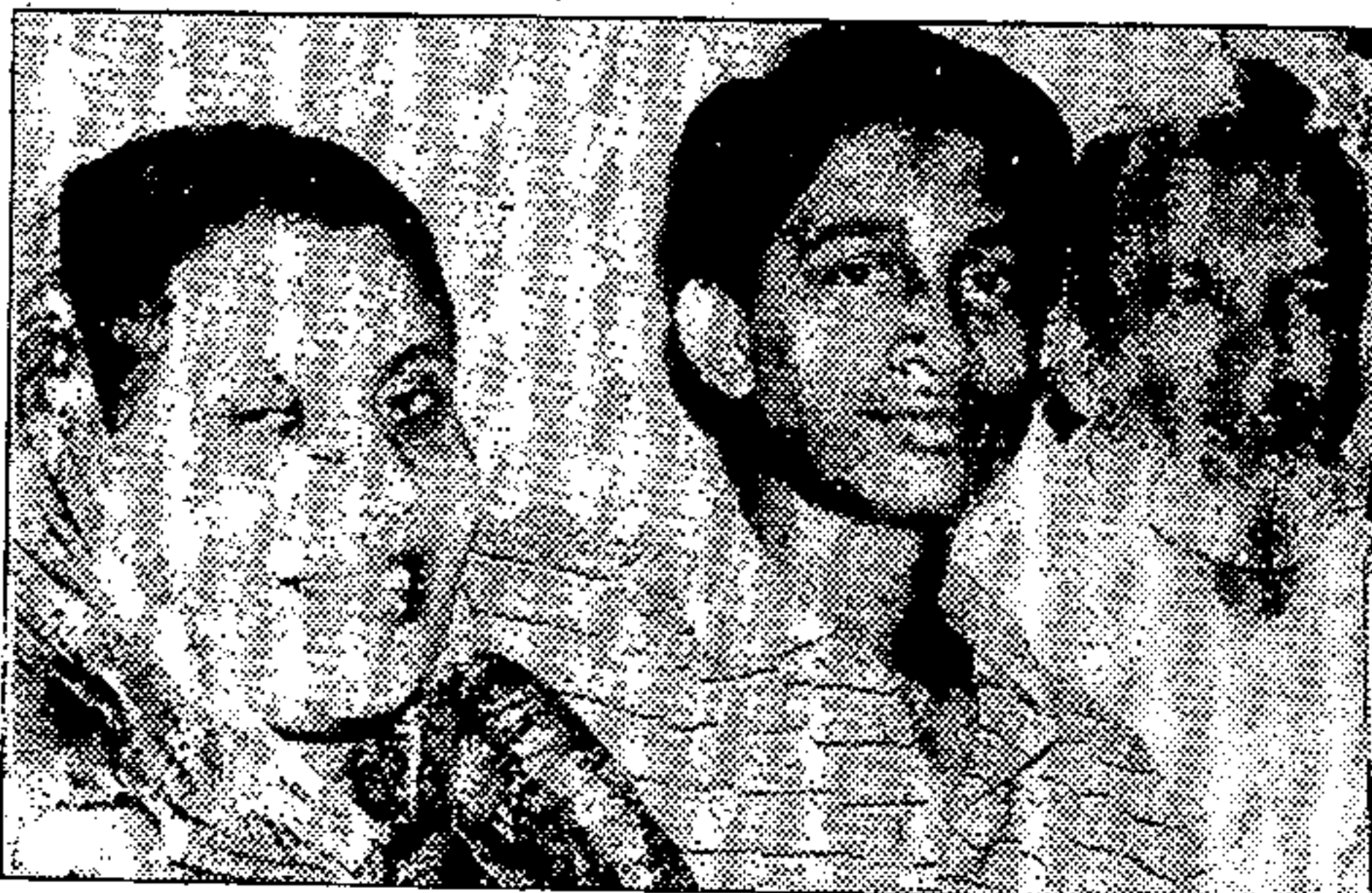
SSC examination under Dhaka Board was held at 158 centres including seven overseas centres between May 2 and May 18.

It may be mentioned here that about 1,35,000 students had appeared the SSC examination last year and the percentage of success had been only 32 per cent.

Of the total 94,866 male students appeared at the examination this year, 65,276 came out successful giving a percentage of pass at 68.81.

On the other hand, 34,751 female students passed the SSC examination out of 53, 137 appeared female students. Their percentage of pass was 65.40.

Group was 78.22 per cent which was much higher than that of social Science Group. The percentage of pass in Social Science Group was only 57.41. Female students, however, did well in Social Science Group where the rate of success was 57.41 per cent for female against 56.26 per cent for male students.

Jalal Ahmed Mirza of Mirzapur Cadet College secured first position in the combined merit list. He obtained a total of 887 marks with letters in English, Mathematics, Geography, Islamiat, General Science and Elective Mathematics.

He was followed by his classmate Nazimuddin Mohammad Wasi Uddin of the same institution. Nazimuddin secured 871 marks with distinctions in English, Mathematics, Geography, Islamiat, General Science and Elective Mathematics.

The third position in Science Group also went to Mirzapur Cadet College. Mohammad tanvir of the college secured 867 marks with letters in five subjects.

Fourteen boys from Mirzapur Cadet College secured positions in

the merit list of Science group and three others were included in Social Science merit list.

Of the leading institutions in the city, Holy Cross College and Agrani Balika Bidyalaya failed to secure any position in the merit list.

Viqarunnissa Noon School and College, however, secured two positions in the merit list for Science students and four position in merit list for Social Science students.

Two positions in science group merit list also went to Government Laboratory School this year.

In Social Science Group, Manishita Ghosh of Udayan Bidyalaya of Dhaka city, topped the merit list securing 780 marks with distinctions in Mathematics, Science and Book Keeping.

The second position went to Mohammad Sarbin Munshi of Faridpur Zila School. He secured a total of 776 marks with distinctions in Mathematics, Geography, Islamiat and Book-Keeping.

Similarly, Mohammad Moazzem Hossain of Delpara High School in Narayanganj secured third position with a total marks of 775.
