

Inquiry into edn sector corruption, malpractices urged

The National Federation of Teachers' Associations demanded constitution of a high powered inquiry committee to investigate various irregularities, corruptions and malpractices in the Ministry of Education.

The Federation in a special conference of its delegates also demanded publication of white paper in this regard.

The conference further demanded constitution of a 'mass education task force' taking representatives of teachers to make education for all by the year 2000.

The conference while welcoming the change of national administration in a democratic manner expressed the hope that the new government would fulfill the genuine demands of teachers.

The conference also discussed campus violence, problems of teachers and other employees of educational institutions and related issues.

Held at the Mohammadpur Central College, the conference elected a new 31-member executive committee with Dr Iajuddin Ahmed of Dhaka University as the
