

1570 examinees expelled on third day

A total of 1570 HSC examinees were expelled from different examination centres for adopting unfair means across the country on the third day of the examinations on Monday.

The English First Paper examination was held peacefully excepting some stray incidents at Pakundia Degree College at Kishoreganj and Baneshwar College at Rajshahi.

The Higher Secondary Certificate (HSC) examination under the four education boards—Dhaka, Comilla, Rajshahi and Jessore began on Thursday last.

Some 544 examinees were expelled from the 15 centres under Dhaka Board followed by Comilla 495, Rajshahi 381 and Jessore 126.

Our Rajshahi Correspondent informed: A group of agitated examinees attacked the office of Principal of the Baneshwar College after the examination allegedly when they have been opposed to adopt unfair means by the invigilators.

Four teachers including Principal of the College were injured following the attack. They were identified as

Abdul Jalil, Principal Jahurul Islam, Madan Kumar Shah, and A.K.M. Mansur. The injured were taken to Baneshwar Health Complex and released after first aid.

UNB adds from Faridpur:—Some 24 examinees were expelled on Monday from five centres of the district on the 3rd day of the Higher Secondary Examination (HSC) for adopting unfair means.

Official sources said of the expelled five were from Rajendra University College Centre, one from Sharda Sufia Women College, six from Sedarpur College, eight from KM College and four from Nagarkanda College.
