

2567 examinees, 19 invigilators expelled

Some 2,567 candidates and 19 invigilators were expelled on the 5th day of the SSC Examination in four education boards for adopting unfair means, officials said, reports UNB.

In last four examinations—Bangla 1st and 2nd papers, and English 1st and 2nd papers—some 4,000 examinees and 50 invigilators were expelled from different centres of the country.

The Secondary School Certificate (SSC) Examinations of 1992 of Dhaka, Rajshahi, Comilla and Jessore Boards began on April 19 amidst tight measures against unfair means.

A total of 6,79,010 candidates were appearing in the examinations this year from 616 centres. Of them, 88 examinees are sitting for the exam at 5 centres abroad under the Dhaka Board.

According to reports reaching in Dhaka, some 614 examinees were expelled in Dhaka Board during the General Mathematics examination on Monday. The total number of examinees in Dhaka Board is 219,582.

About 1,108 examinees and 6 invigilators were expelled from Rajshahi Board. The expelled invigilators were one each in Naogaon and Dinajpur and four in Pabna.

Under the Rajshahi Board, 154,318 students are appearing in the SSC Examination.

In Comilla Board over 721 SSC

examinees and 13 invigilators were expelled on Monday. Of the invigilators, six in Comilla district and seven in Chittagong. A total of 167,416 students under Comilla Board are sitting for the examinations.

The Controller's office sources said about 124 SSC candidates were expelled in ten districts under the Jessore Education Board. The total number of examinees in the board is 137,694.

No major untoward incident took place during the Mathematics examination on Monday.

In Chittagong district, two invigilators were assaulted by some expelled examinees at Sitakund centre.

Examination authorities recovered two sackful of copies during searching of examinees at Haripur centre under Daudkandi of Comilla district.
