Over 100 rooms of Textile College ransacked

More than one hundred rooms including Principal's office, administrative offices, halls and lecture theaters of the college of Textile Engineering and Technology at Tejgaon were ransacked by a group of outsiders backed by a section of college students on Tuesday morning allegedly over unsuccessful results of two students leaders.

The college authorities sought police help to bring the situation under control. Several platoons of police have been deployed in and around the college premises.

The college administration said that the incident ensued over the unsuccessful results of the General Secretary of Central Students Union of the College and Vice-President of a Residential Halls Students Union on Tuesday morning.

The unsuccessful students became angry with the college authorities and attacked the college along with a group of outsiders at about 9 a.m. They damaged window panes of the lecture theaters, ransacked offices of accounts department and Principal's office. They also disconnected the phone connections and damaged college properties.

The attackers fled the scene sensing presence of police on the campus. A case has been registered with Tejgaon police.
