Robertson lectures on medical education

Dr R F Robertson, immediate past President, Royal College of Physicians of Edinburgh and President designate of British Medical Association on Wednesday delivered a lecture on medical education at Bir- den under the auspices of Bangladesh Medical Association.

While dealing with various aspects of medical education, Dr Robertson remarked that the standard of post-graduate medical education in Bangladesh was quite high and as good as MRCP, FRCS—if not harder.

He also emphasised the need for practical training of undergraduates and continued education for all medical practitioners.
